ORANGE DAY CELEBRATION

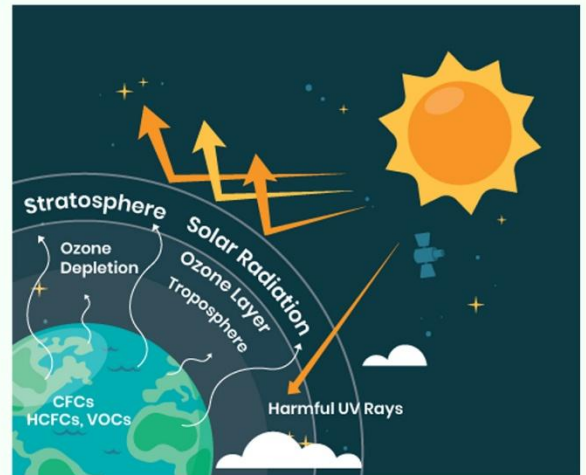

Students from Primary participated enthusiastically showcasing their creativity and understanding of healthy eating habits through colourful and meaningful drawing, posters, Essay writings.

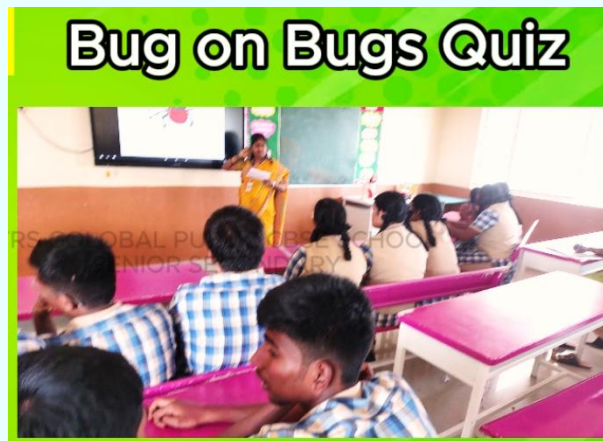

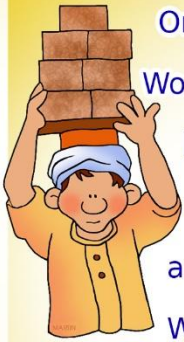
